The Plaintiff Defendant at the prayer of the said Plaintiff  
recorded at folio. viz:

In Obedience to a Commission from the High Court of  
Chancery dated the Eighteenth of February last emp=  
owering us to examine evidences concerning the bounded trees  
of two tracts of Land called upper Quitting & Pewksbury,  
belonging to the Orphans of Colonell Thomas Hollyday  
we do this day fall before us Colonell Nihinan Beale  
who made oath upon the holy Evangelist that, Burnt stump  
of a white Oak (at no Stump heken was), was marked for the second  
bounded tree of upper Getting, also the second bound tree of  
Pewksbury & was the North East bound tree of Scotts lot,  
also the second bound tree of Dundee, & the first tree of  
Pho: Plumers land near to w<sup>ch</sup> Stump stands a white  
oak bounded by M<sup>r</sup> Clem<sup>t</sup> Hill standing in the first  
line of upper quitting

Also the sd Colonell Beale carried us to a dead white oak  
standing on Collington, n<sup>th</sup> he deposod was the first bounded  
tree of Pewksbury and the third bound tree of upper Quitting, n<sup>th</sup>  
the tree being dead M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Greenfield bounded a small  
white oak n<sup>th</sup> four Notches on two sides, being about five or  
six foot from the dead tree and stands a little above abridge  
over the sd Collington Swamp
