 for William Chaplin bounded on y^e Chaplin's Land
 for y^e length of fifty p^{er} to a marked poebichory tree
 standing near the sprickets house being North east
 two of the Chaplin's Land and running from y^e poebichory
 tree South west for y^e length of fifty p^{er} to another
 marked tree standing on the South east of y^e Chaplin's Land
 and running from y^e Chaplin's Oak South east fifty
 p^{er} to a bounded oak standing by a swamp side near
 the creek bounded on the east wth a parallel drawn
 North east for the length of one hundred & fifty
 p^{er} to y^e first bounded tree and laid out for three
 hundred and fifty and more or less y^e said Land lying
 in Calvert County being first taken up by Wm. Pritchel
 and by his son Jⁿ Pritchel sold to the said Jochem
 Kierstedt being now in the possⁿ of one Rebecca Neake
 widow. And all that pcell of Land being the eastern most
 p^{er}ts of two pcells of Land formerly laid out for Henry
 Courcy and John Read lying in Calvert County on the
 north side of Pattupent River near following point
 Beginning at a bounded white Oak with eight notches at
 the head of a branch and running East two hundred eighty
 five p^{er} to the North east bounds of Henry Courcy's Land
 then South about fifty five p^{er} to the North east bound of
 John Read's Land thence wth a continued South Line
 about fifty four p^{er} to y^e intersection of Richard Harris's
 Land now in the possⁿ of Thomas Edmondy Tho^s Goslin
