thereof and of Every part and parcell thereof doth  
hereby clearly and Absolutely Acquitt Exonerate and  
Discharge the Same William Nicholson his heirs  
Ex<sup>ors</sup> and Adm<sup>rs</sup> hath given Absolutely Acquitt
