Whereas by an act of Assembly past at a General  
 Assembly begun and held at Annapolis the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of 8<sup>th</sup> last June 1719 the  
 Underscribers Geo: Gaskellant<sup>r</sup> Workington Charles Ballard Benj<sup>o</sup>  
 Wailer as Commissioners to Cause three thousand acres of Land to be laid  
 out for the use of the Nantuxke Indians for so long as they shall Occupy  
 same and further to Cause such Land to be valued by a Jury of substantial  
 freeholders and Will doo hereby Certifie that on said about the fourteenth  
 day of December Anno Domini thousand seven hundred & twenty we did  
 Cause M<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Whittington Jun<sup>r</sup> Survey to lay out for the said Indians  
 twenty five hundred acres of Land on the North Side of Broad Creeke being  
 a tract of Land called Greenland bounded as followeth Beginning at a  
 marked white tree standing near the landing place of Broad Creeke  
 running down the said Creeke and bounded w<sup>th</sup> North twenty one degrees  
 and thirty minutes West seven hundred and six by six poles to a marked  
 Spanish Cake on the East Side of a small Creek called White Creeke  
 thence north East five hundred and ninety poles to a marked white Cake  
 thence East by South three hundred and sixty two poles to a marked white  
 Cake thence South twenty Six degrees East by Six hundred and forty  
 five poles to the main Branch of the said Broad Creeke thence down  
 the Branch and bounded the  
 boundary containing and containing  
 two thousand five hundred acres

And we do farther  
 Cause M<sup>r</sup> Whittington to lay out for the use of the said Indians on the South  
 Side of Broad Creeke five hundred acres of Land bounded as followeth  
 Beginning at a marked white cake standing on the South Side of Broad  
 Creeke
