This Indenture made this second day of November
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
sixty & twelve between James Beall of Prince George County
gent of the one part and Stephen Johnson of the same
County Cooper of the other part witnesseth that the said
James for and in consideration of the sum of twenty five
four thousand pounds of tobacco to him in hand allor before
the rufecing and delivery of these presents well and truly
paid or secured to be paid by the said James to the receipt
whereof he the said James doth hereby acknowledge and
thereof doth acquit and discharge him the said Stephen his
heirs Ex^t and adm^r for woe by these presents as also for
divers other good causes and considerations him therunto
moving hath demised granted taken and to have
Lettion and by these presents doth demise grant and to
have taken and had unto him the said Stephen his heirs
and assigns All that Mesuage orement called Bealls
discredy being part of a tract Called Bealls pleasure
lying to the eastward of Bealls pasture and on the East
Side of a branch called the Cat tide Marsh and on the
South Side of a beaverdam Marsh that fowls out of the
Eastern branch of Potomac river Beginning at a black
Oak standing on a point by the beaverdam side it
being the first bound tree of the said tract and running up
the said tract marsh branch South East eighty four per
then East one hundred and ten perches to a point of
land taken up by Ed Henry Fowles running thence East eighteen
degrees
