 one thousand seven hundred and thirteen Between Thomas Chamberlain  
 of Baltimore County Gent of the one part and Charles Carroll of the City

 and in Consideration of the Sum of Eighty Seven pounds Currant and Lawfull  
 money of Great Brittain to him in hand paid by the said Charles Carroll  
 Esq the receipt whereof the said Thomas doth hereby acknowledge  
 and thereof doth acquit and discharge him the said Charles Carroll his  
 heirs
