

This Indenture made the second day of Nov: Anno Domini one  
 thousand seven hundred and ten Between Henry Ward of the County of  
 Cecil and province of Maryland Gent of the one part and Edward Parrish of the  
 County of Annarundell and province aforesaid Cooper of the other part Witnesseth  
 that whereas Henry Ward late of Cecil County Deced father of the above Henry  
 had the twenty second day of September Anno Domini one thousand six hundred  
 fifty eight surveyed for him a tract of Land called Mount serado in the County of  
 Baltimore upon the west side of the Chesapeake River beginning at a marked  
 Chestnut Oak standing on the side of a hill and running from the said Tree up the  
 River North two hundred and seventy five perches to a marked Birch tree standing  
 on a point and from the said Birch tree west into the woods three hundred and  
 twenty perches bounded on the west by a Line drawn South South East two  
 hundred and seventy five perches bounded on the south south East by a Line  
 drawn East to the first marked Oak Cut and laid out for five hundred  
 and fifty acres and part thereupon Granted him in Common form  
 relation being had unto the said Grant doth and may more or at Large  
 appear And this Indenture further witnesseth that the said  
 Henry Ward son and heir of the above Grant for and in consideration of  
 the said hundred acres of Land called Haydowne lying in Cecil County originally  
 surveyed for and granted to Henry Ward late of the province aforesaid Deed the  
 Receipt of w<sup>ch</sup> Land w<sup>th</sup> title and possession to the said Henry acknowledged  
 to have reced before the sealing and delivery of these presents the w<sup>ch</sup> fully  
 paid and satisfied and for the same hath given granted bargained sold alienated  
 in seoffe and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alienate  
 in seoffe and confirm unto him the said Edward Parrish his heirs and assigns  
 for ever all that part of the aforesaid tract of Land called Mount serado lying within  
 following bounds containing and laid out for two hundred and fifty acres of Land  
 to w<sup>ch</sup> same upon true examination more less beginning at two Chestnut  
 Oaks each marked w<sup>th</sup> twelve notches standing by the River side by a Deep  
 gutter and running up the River north west Six degrees west of each one  
 hundred
