 Bosley of Manslod in the County of Essex Esquire in one bond or
 obligation bearing date the fourth day of April now Instant in
 the sum or penalty of hundred pounds of lawful Money of England
 Conditioned for payment of the sum of fifty pounds of Lawfull Money
 (on)
