This Indenture made the one and Twentieth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifteen . . . Between John Talbot of the County of Annapolis in the province of Maryland of the one part and Henry Hall of the said County and province of the other part Witnesses that whereas Charles Lord proprietor of the said province by his L<sup>ty</sup>s patents under his greater Seal at Armes bearing the thirteenth day of August Anno 1714 for the Consideration therein mentioned did Grant unto John Talbot of and to Elizabeth Hutchins of the said County by the names of John and Elizabeth Son and Daughter of Edward Talbot Sen<sup>r</sup> late of the said Co<sup>ty</sup> Deced<sup>d</sup> all that Tract or parcel of land Called Talbotts Revolution manner lying in the woods on a Ride called Elk Beginning at a bounded white oak and Hickory & running South west eighty two perches to a bound Red oak and Chestnut then north west four hundred thirty six perches to a bounded oak then south west three hundred eighty one perches to a bounded poplar still (south)
