Wee James Harris and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Kent in the
Province of Maryland send greeting knowing that whereas Charles
later Lord Baltimore absolute Lord and proprietor of the province
of Noble Memory did under the Great Seal of his province bearing
date sometime in the year one thousand six hundred eighty five grant
unto Edward Jones by the name of Edward Jones Gent of the County
want for the taking up and surveying of two hundred and fifty acres of
Land in Cecil County according to his Lordships Condition of Planters
by Vertue of the said warrant upon the sixth day of July Anno one
thousand six hundred eighty five was surveyed and plotted by the said
D^r of Survey for Cecil County as by the Cert of Survey returned into his
Lordships Land Office where it doth or may more at large appear
Laid out for Edward Jones of Cecil County Gent a parcel of Land called
properly lying in the County afo^r and upon the East side of a river called
Whitaker at the head of St Albans Creek at the head of a parcel
of Land called Laramore now enlarged Beginning at the branch side
near the horse bridge and running thence South West and by South
bounding on the said Land two hundred and fifty feet thence South
East
