 This Indenture made this seventeenth day of Decemb^r
 Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and fifteen Between Benjamin
 Mackall of Calo County in the prync of mary land Gent of the one parte and
 Thomas Corne of the County and prync of Chyrurgeon of the other parte
 wittnesse that the said Ben^r Mackall for and in Consideration of the
 sume of three hund pounds Sterl. money of great Brittain to him in
 hand paid by the s^r Thomas Corne before the sealing and Delivery hereof
 the receipt he doth hereby acknowledge and himselfe thoro^{ly} fully
 satisfied contented and glad and thercof and thercof and thercof
 doth acquit honorably release and discharge the said Thomas Corne his heirs &
 adm^r and every of them by these presents forever HAVE given granted
 bargained sold aliened release and confirmed and by these presents
 doth give grant bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the
 s^r Thomas Corne his heirs and assigns forever all those tract or
 parcels of Land that the s^r Ben^r Mackall is now Possessed of
 in Calo County on the West side of the great Bay Beginning at a bounded Gum
 at the mouth of a stream adjoining to the Land of a certain Stephen
 Benson by the side of the s^r Bay of those parts and running down the s^r
 Bay to the Divisionall Line formerly run out between a certⁿ Thomas
 Shelving and Patrick Allen bounded on the South by a line drawn West
 Parcell to the Line in the Pat^r to the head Line of the s^r five
 hundred Acres of Land bounding on the west and running according
 to the Pat^r to the Land of the s^r Benson and with the said Land to
 the first bounded tree containing by estimation two hundred and fifty acres
 of Land ALSO all that tract or parcel of Land lying on the North
 side of the freshes of Patuxent River which was taken up and patented
 in the name of a certⁿ Rich^d Hall which was conveyed by the said Rich^d
 son of the said Rich^d Hall to a certⁿ Tom Head being part of a tract of
 Land cont^g one hundred and sixty six Acres called and known by the
 name of Additional Spittle lying in the woods on the North side of the s^r
 freshes of Patuxent River upon the branches of Coxes Creek Beginning
 at a bounded poplar it being the South East corner tree of a parcel
 of Land then in the Possⁿ of a certⁿ Tom Wadsworth called Timbercock
 and running wth the said Land South West two hundred and forty
 till it intersect the North Line of the Land which was then in the
 Possⁿ of a certⁿ John Keycross called Rowington then running
 with the said Land One hundred and seventy ft. till it intersect
 the West Line of the Land of the s^r Hall called Spittle and running
 with the said Land north one hundred and six perches and thence
 continuing North to the first bounded tree containing and surveyed for
 (Nine)
