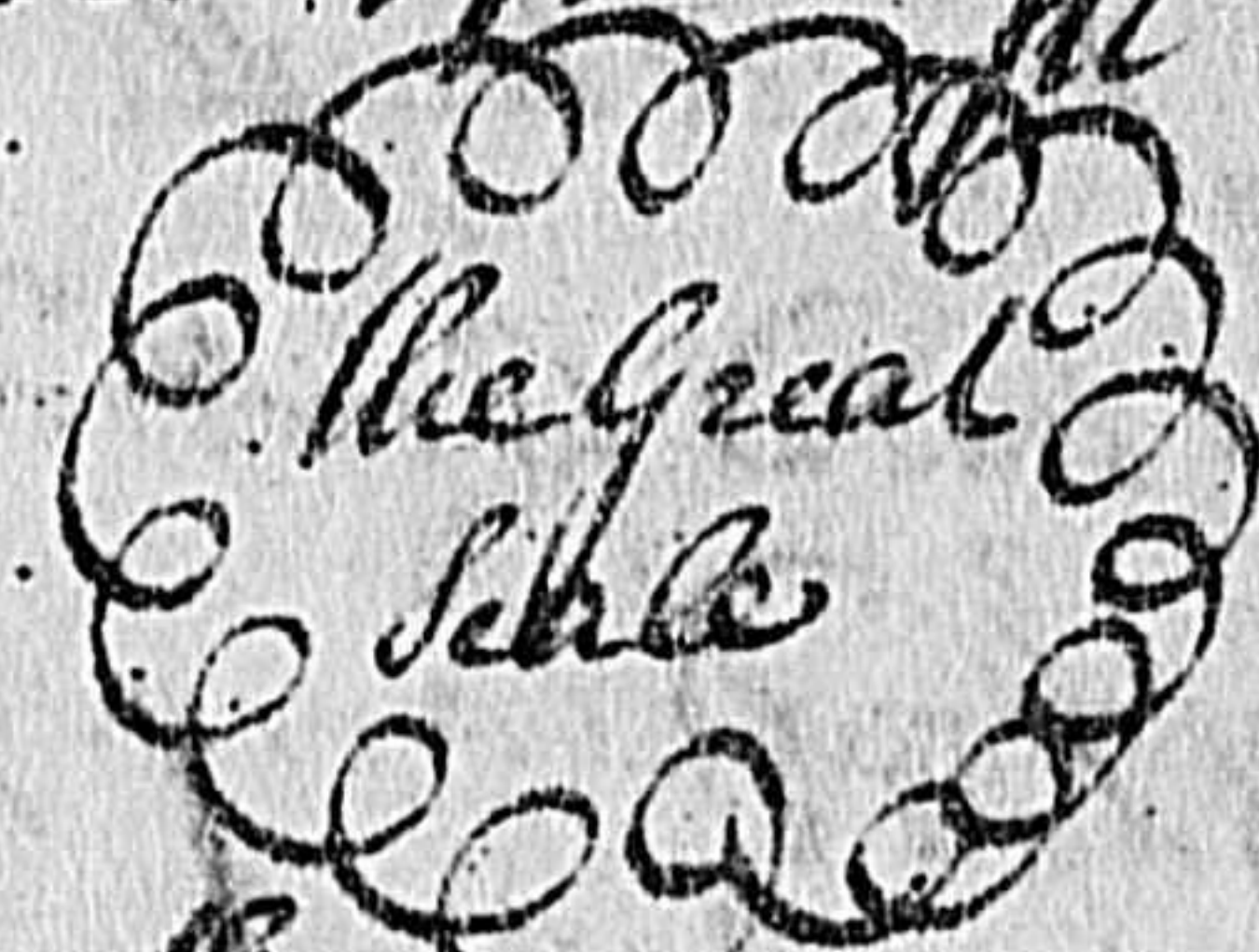

Whereas by Virtue of an Act of Parliament
 made in the 7th and 8th Years of the reign of King Geo³
 3^d Entituled An Act for preventing Frauds and regulat-
 ing abuses in the plantation trade, The Navall Officers
 in his Majestys plantations are within Two months
 or as soon as Conoeniently it may be after their Entrance
 upon the said Employment, to give sufficient Security to
 the Commissioners of his Majesties Customs in England
