Land & Negroes subject to a mortgage to be void on payment of the sum

Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Land and Negroes
not being a suff^{ic} security for the said sum for the further securing the
repayment thereof and also for and in full of the sum of five shill
to show the said Cecilius Buller and Mary his wife or one of them in
hand paid thereof whereof they do hereby acknowledge and thereof
they the said Cecilius Buller and Mary his wife have granted bargain
sold and by these presents do and either of them doth grant
bargain and sell unto the said John Hyde his heirs and assigns
All that tract or parcel of Land called Roystons purchase
lying and being in Cecil County in the Wood and upon a branch
of a creek called Sassafras creek beginning at a marked white Oak
