Upon Your arrival in Maryland You are to publish my Directions to you for opening the Land office, and that for the future the Custom usually paid for Land warrants in Tobacco according to my last Ordinance of Plantations is to be paid in Money upon the striking of such Warrants at the Rate of one penny of a pound and that I having found a great Inconvenience in the parceling out Warrants by the people obtaining the same so as no account could be kept regularly when such Warrants were out but Severals Subscribers have returned Certificates for more Land then was contained in the warrants upon which they grounded their Surety being
