

324 You are to grant to Henry Wharton One hundred forty
 Six Acres called the Neighbourhood adjoining to the
 Hall in case the same belong to me

You are to grant to Henry Cwall a piece of Wheat Land
 of Two or Three hundred Acres

You are to grant Gerard Stys a piece or pieces of Wheat
 Land of five hundred Acres in all, in full Compensation of
 his pretensions to five hundred Acres sold to his father by
 Charles Calvert and supposed to be within any Mannor of Jam
 Arundels for which I have also given Captain Richard
 Smith a Compensation pretending Right thereto from the
 said Charles Calvert's father

You are to grant Anne Duckworth One hundred Acres
 of Land being in Consideration of the like Quantity, I hope
 well her former Husband pretended a right therein
 in the Mannor the said One hundred Acres to be
 out of the Old Mannor in St. Marys County, But
 with the least Prejudice to the remainder

You are hereby required to Authorize Mr. Henry Darnall
 to let lease the Mannors of the Western Shore at the Usual
 fine of Forty Shillings and yearly Rent of ten Shillings
 of hundred Acres, and also to receive the rents and fines aforesaid
 and the Arrear thereof, who is to Account with you yearly for
 the same such Lease to be for one and twenty years lives
 and no more, as for my Mannors on the Eastern Shore you are to
 Lease them any part thereof at the fine and rents, I do hereby
 further Order and Inpower you to Authorize and Appoint the said
 Mr. Henry Darnall to my Chamber Generall within my Province
 Wherein I have received from Capt. Richard Smith two Letters
 in One whereof he claims the Benefit of a promise of mine of
 a Letter by me writt to his wife Barbara Darnall about one
 (Thousand)
