eth that the said Tho: Gwin for and in consideration of the sum of  
Twenty six pounds Sterling to him in hand paid by the said Wm  
Roberson the Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge &  
thereof & of every part & parcel thereof both fully and absolutely  
acquits, honorates and discharge the said Wm Roberson his Executors  
Admin<sup>rs</sup> by these presents hath given granted Bargained sold Aliened  
Engrossed and confirmed, and by these presents doth give grant  
Bargain <sup>sell</sup> aliened Engross & confirm unto the said Wm Roberson  
his heirs and Assignes for ever, All that parcel of Land formerly  
said out for Paul Amey of the Province of P. planter called  
Brandon formerly lying in annerundell County but now in  
Baltimore County on the south side of Patuxent River and on  
the north west side of a creek in of said River called Deep Creek  
Except Sixty acres part thereof sold by the said Thomas Gwin  
unto a certain Tho: Crocker) Beginning at a marked White Oak tree  
at the mouth of the Creek standing upon a point running  
for breadth up the creek Southward and by west line One hundred  
perches to another Oak bounded on the west by a line drawn North  
from the said Oak right angles and by a line drawn North  
West and by west from the End of the north line three hundred and  
twenty perches for Length on the north by a line drawn North East  
and by East from the End of the north west and by west line One  
hundred perches to another Oak on the side <sup>of</sup> Brandon bay  
on the East by the said Bay unto the first marked Oak ~~marked~~  
on the south by Deep Creek containing and then laid out for  
Two hundred and fifty acres more or less together with all  
Rights Privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging
