

William Secoy of London Notary Public being a person well known and  
 worthy of credit and did by solemn oath <sup>swear</sup> he look upon the holy Evangelists  
 of the mighty God before us then and there solemnly Sweard to give and  
 depose to be true that he was present and did see Thomas Tailor Seal Pas  
 hisse and deed Deliver a certain Deed of Adventure bearing date  
 ninth day of Sept: Anno Dom 1709 now exhibited unto him the said Depo  
 whole ~~and~~ unperfaced & uncancelled made between the said Thomas  
 Tailor by the name and addition of Thomas Tailor Late of the County  
 of Maryland in Parts beyond the seas but then in London in the  
 Kingdom of Great Britain Merchant of the one Part and John Tailor by  
 the name and addition of John Tailor of Lond<sup>m</sup> Merchant son of the said  
 Thomas Tailor of the other part and that the said Depo<sup>nant</sup> as a  
 witness to the said Deed did thereupon write and endorse his name and  
 Qualification as thereby it doth & may appear And further the  
 said Depo<sup>nant</sup> saith that the Copy now also exhibited signed and attested  
 by him the said Depo<sup>nant</sup> (the said Copy is herebefore written) was by  
 him duly examined with the said original deed & by him found to  
 agree word for word therewith.

In faith and Testimony whereof we the said Lord Mayor  
 and Aldermen have caused the Seal of the Office of Mayoralty  
 of the said City of London to be hereunto put & affixed Dated  
 in London the fifth day of Feb<sup>r</sup>: Anno Dom 1711 and in  
 the tenth year of the Reigne of our Sovereign Lady Anne  
 Queen of Great Brittain &c.
