they the said Charles Humphry & Francis do hereby acknowledge
and themselves therewith fully satisfied & paid thereof every part
and parcel thereof do clearly acquit & discharge & discharge the
said John Gray his heirs & assigns forever by these presents
have given granted aliened & confirmed and confirmed and by these
presents do fully clearly & absolutely give grant bargain & alien
confirm and confirm unto the said John Gray that moiety or half part
of a tract of land called the plain lying on the west side Chesapeake
River and on the head of a Creek called Saverdam Creek
Beginning at a bounded pine and running South and by East
thirty perches then South East two hundred perches to a bounded
pine and from the said pine by a line drawn South one
hundred and thirty perches bounded on the South by a line drawn
North west four hundred ninety five perches to a marked white
Oak and from the said Oak by a line drawn North one hundred &
thirty perches bounded on the North by a line drawn South
East to the first bounded tree containing and now laid out for
four hundred acres more or less and whereas the other moiety
or half part of the said four hundred acres not here by conveyed
or intended to be conveyed was on the seventeenth day of
January 1692 conveyed by Zacharia Gray to John Deasely

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
