 premises w<sup>th</sup> their Appurtenances and twelve Head of Cattle Ten Head  
 of Sheep and One Negro Man named Tom, Given to the said Sarah  
 Bricke her Heirs and Assigns for ever provided always  
 it is the true Intent and meaning of these presents that if  
 the said John Frizole his Heirs Exors or Adm<sup>rs</sup> shall well and  
 truly pay unto the said Sarah Bricke her Exors Adm<sup>rs</sup> or Assigns  
 at or upon the first day of June which shall be in the  
 Year of Our Lord God Seventeen hundred and twenty five the  
 Sum of forty pounds Sterl w<sup>th</sup> fifteen p<sup>ts</sup> Cent thereon and the  
 Cost of Protest (In Case a certain Sort of Bills of Exchange  
 bearing such Date w<sup>th</sup> these presents drawn by the said John  
 Frizole for the said Sum on John Midford Merchant in London  
 payable to the said Sarah Bricke shall not be Accepted and  
 paid according to the Tenor thereof) or such part thereof as  
 shall be protested w<sup>th</sup> lawfull Interest on the said Sum to  
 be accounted from the Day on which the said John Frizole his  
 Heirs Executors or Adm<sup>rs</sup> shall have Notice of the protest of  
 the said Bill as also well and truly pay unto the said Sarah  
 Bricke her Exors Adm<sup>rs</sup> or Assigns the Sum of Twenty seven  
 pounds sixteen Shillings and seven pence Sterl Money of Great Britain  
 w<sup>th</sup> lawfull Interest for the same at the house of the said Sarah  
 Bricke at or upon the first day of June in the Year of Our  
 Lord God Seventeen hundred Twenty five and all Charges  
 of drawing recording and Making Over of this Good  
 That then this Good and the Estate therein made shall cease
