heirs & assigns & assigns to be performed of same  
I have hereunto set my hand the 28<sup>th</sup> day of  
October 1652. Rich<sup>d</sup> Bennett

Artic<sup>l</sup>es of peace and Amity concluded and  
agreed upon between the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> Charles  
Absolute Lord and Proprietor of this province of  
~~Virginia~~ Roanoke and Kinsalun and Waspunge Chief  
of the Appataque and Coromako Indians on behalf  
of themselves and the Indians under their Subjection  
this 22<sup>d</sup> day of October 1722

It is agreed upon that from this day forward there  
be an inviolable peace and Amity between the Right
