

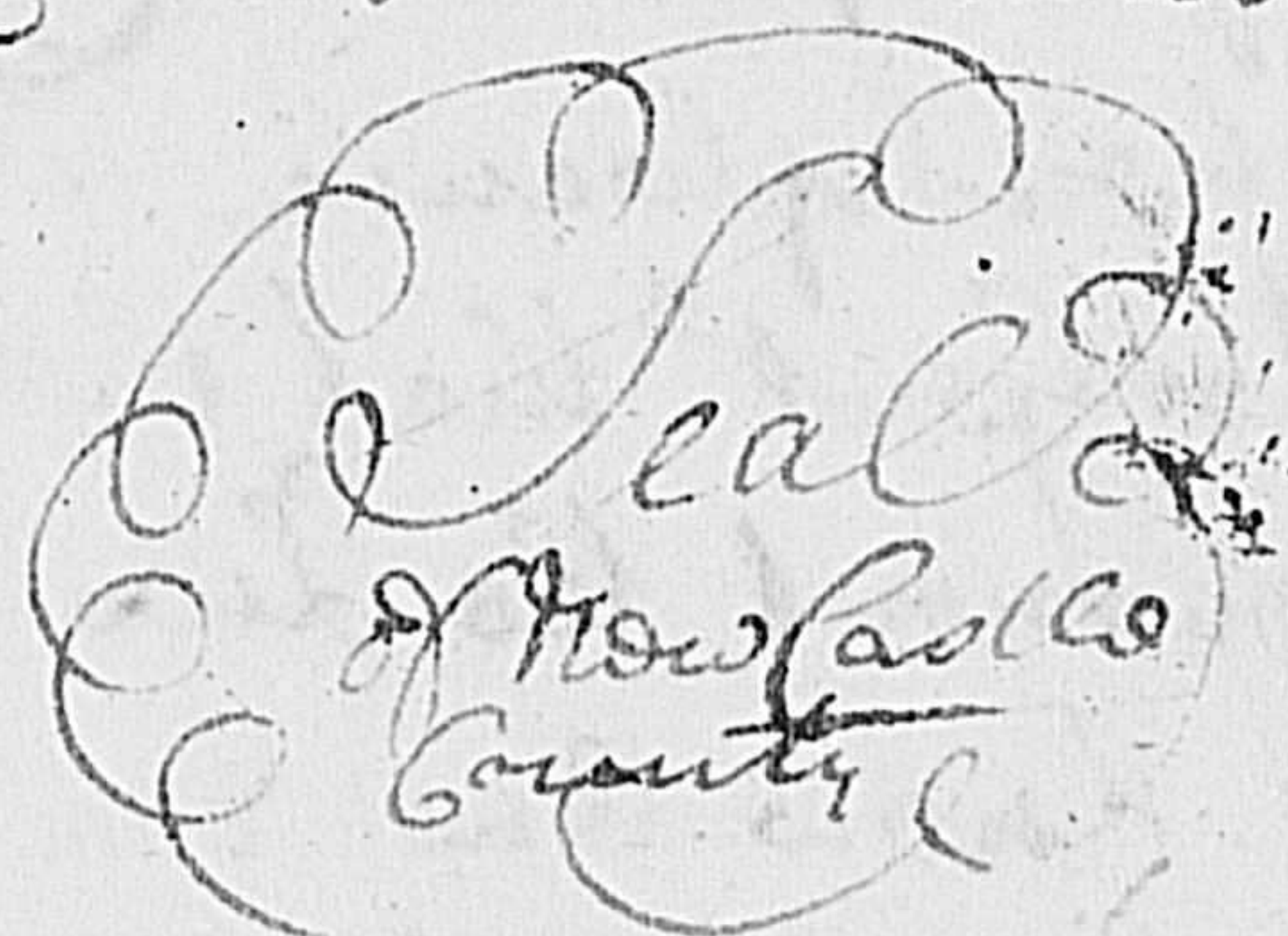
501 Seven hundred & Nine the above mentioned Fonge made known
the Draught of the said Land together with the manner of the said
Edward Green's Dying with a known Heir or Relations as above
said unto a certain Matthew Vauobber of Guil County in Maryland
Merchant who with the said Fonge contrived in a false and forged
manner to make a deed for the said Land unto John Scott late of
George's Hundred in the said County of Newcastle Governor then
Governor but lost the hand writing of the said Fonge he
discovered the falseness of the said deed it being dated the twenty
first day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand Six hun-
dred Ninety and One (which was about two hundred years before the said
Fonge came to the Country) the said Fonge wrote a Draught of the
said deed, which was drawn afterwards by Isaac Vauobber of Guil
County aforesaid brother of the aforesaid Matthew and
entered upon the Records of the Public Office for the said County of
Newcastle (as Relation thereunto being had) may fully appear
and afterwards the said Fonge told this Dependent that he had burnt
the said forged deed that it might never appear in Judgment against
him and this Dependent further declares that the said Fonge for
and in consideration of his assistance and service in the Forgery
aforesaid obtained from the said Matthew Vauobber a bond conditioned for the
payment of fifty pounds by him to the said Fonge
