them by these presents They the said Henry Woodward &  
Mary ~~Woodward~~ his wife have and each of them hath  
granted bargained sold aliened released enjoyed & Confirmed  
and by these presents Do and each of them Doth grant  
bargain sell alien enjoy and Confirm unto him the said  
Thomas Johnson Junior his heirs and Assigns for ever —  
All that Lot of Ground lying and being in the City of  
Annapolis aforesaid devised by Samuel Young the Grandfather  
of the aforesaid Mary in and by his Testament and Last  
will to Richard Young the son of him the said Samuel Young  
and Mother of the aforesaid Mary Together with all Privileges
