This Indenture Made the third day of April in the Year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and sixty seven Between Henry Hall of Ann Arundel County in the Province of Maryland Gentleman of the one part and John Hall of the City of Annapolis Attorney at Law of the other part Witnesseth that the said Henry Hall for and in Consideration of the Sum of eight hundred and sixty pounds five Shillings Sterling Money of Great Brittain to him in hand paid by the said John Hall the Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and thereof and of every part and Parcel thereof doth acquit and discharge the said John Hall by these Presents Hath given granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents Doth give grant bargain sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said John Hall and his heirs the following Tracts or Parcels of Land that is to say All that Tract or Parcel of Land lying and being in Frederick County called Henry and Elizabeth enlarged Beginning at a Wounded Chesnut standing on the south side of a branch called the doe branch
