This Indenture made the first Day of March in the Year of our Lord One
thousand seven hundred and sixty Seven Between George Ashman of Baltimore County
Planta of the one part and Robert Alexander of Baltimore County Gentleman of the
other part Witnesseth that for and in Consideration of two Shillings Sterling money
to the said George Ashman in hand paid by the said George Ashman hath bargained and
sold and by these presents Doth bargain and sell unto the said Robert Alexander all
that Tract or parcel of Land called Ashmans Hope Situate lying and being in Baltimore
County aforesaid containing three hundred and twelve Acres more or less except so much thereof
as in the possession of a certain Thomas Harrison and the Reversion and Reversions
Remainder,
