 East from a certain Corner Marking standing on the Southwesterly Side of the said
 Road at the Head of a Valley some small Distance from Joseph Meids's Fence and
 Plantation being a Boundary between Doctor Shuyter Bouckholt and the said Henry
 Vaubobber and the same tree mentioned in a certain Mathias Vaubobbers Deed to a certain
 James Vaubobber and then running from said marked Red Oak by and with the Land sold
 and conveyed by the said Henry Vaubobber to the said Shuyter Bouckholt to a marked Service
 Tree standing at the End of the South twenty two Degrees West forty six perches Line of a
 said Land and where is now a large Stone placed thereby and running from thence South fifty
 One Degree West Sixteen Perches to an old Road that crosses the Branch at the head of a
 brook called Garrott Wyndman's brook then North Seventy Degrees West across the said
 Branch thirteen perches to a white Oak standing on the west Side of said Branch
 marked with six Notches then South Seven Degrees and a Half West twenty six perches
 then South thirty three Degrees West Twelve perches then South Sixty Degrees and a half
 West twelve perches then South forty two Degrees West sixteen Perches then South Sixty
 two Degrees West sixteen perches then South Seventy Degrees West fourteen perches
 then South thirty two Degrees West sixteen Perches then South sixty six Degrees West
 Eighteen perches then South thirty six Degrees West twenty two perches then South Sixty
 Degrees West eight perches then South forty One Degrees West eight perches then South
 thirty Eight Degrees West fourteen perches to a large black Oak standing by the River
 Side marked with twelve Notches and then running from the said Oak across the mouth of
 the said brook up the River and binding thence with to the Place of Beginning and for the
 settling and assuring thereof to and for the uses Intents and purposes herein after limited
 expressed and declared and in consideration of five Shillings to him in hand by the said
 John Meids the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold
 released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell release and
 confirm unto the said John Meids in his actual possession now being by Virtue of a
 Bargain and Sale thereof made bearing Date the Sixth Day of January last and
