and William Barney did acknowledge the within Instrument of writing as their Act and Deed
and the within bargained and released promises to be the Right and Estate of the within
named John Beale Bordley according to the true Intent and meaning thereof And that
Frances Holland being also by us examined apart from and out of the Hearing of her said
Husband did acknowledge and declare the within Instrument to be her Act and Deed and
the within bargained and released promises to be the Right and Estate of the within named
John Beale Bordley according to the true Intent and meaning of the within Deed And that
She did sign seal and deliver the same and made this Acknowledgement freely and
voluntarily without any Threats or compulsion of or from her said Husband or for fear
of his displeasure And at the same time came Eleanor the wife of the said John Euson
and being privately examined apart from and out of the hearing of her said Husband
did acknowledge the within promises to be the Right and Estate of the said John Beale
Bordley free and clear from any Right or Title of Dower of her said Eleanor and did
declare she did by this Acknowledgement release all her Right Title and Claim of
Dower of and in the within Lands and promises and that She made this Acknowledge-
ment of her own free will and consent without any compulsion of or threats from her
said Husband or fear of his displeasure
