This Indenture made the twenty fifth Day of February in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty eight Between John Worthington son of John of Annapolis County in the Province a^s and John Worthington son of William of Baltimore County and Province a^s of the one part and William Worthington son of William of Baltimore County and Province a^s of the other part Whereas John Worthington formerly of Annapolis County deceased by his Last Will and Testament in Writing duly proved and Allowed in the Prerogative Court at Annapolis among other things therein contained did bequeath and devise unto the a^s John Worthington son of John of Annapolis County William Worthington son of William and John Worthington son of William both of Baltimore County One thousand and sixty three Acres of Land lying and being in Frederick County in the Province a^s commonly called or known by the Name of the Addition to Whiskies Ridge to be Divided between them the said John Worthington son John, John Worthington son William and William Worthington son William who have all mutually agreed upon a Division of the said Land between them agreeable to the True intent and meaning of the Will a^s of John Worthington deceased Now this Indenture therefore Witnesseth that the a^s John Worthington son of John and John Worthington son of William as well for and in Consideration of the intent and meaning of the Will a^s as of the sum of five shillings to them in hand by the said William Worthington son of William the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge and themselves to be therewith fully satisfied and Contented Have and by these presents do give grant release and Confirm unto the a^s William Worthington son William his heirs and Assigns for ever All that part of the a^s Tract or parcel of Land called The Addition to Whiskies Ridge contained within the following Metes and Bounds Courses and Distances (viz^t) Beginning at the end of the eighth Course of the Addition of Whiskies Ridge (South)
