Part and Parcel thereof to have and to hold the said Tract of Land thereby Grant-
ed bargained and Sold or intended so to be and Premises with the Appurtenances
and every Part and Parcel thereof to him the said William Brown his Heirs
and Assigns to the only Proper Use and Behoof of him the said William Brown
his Heirs and Assigns forever Under the Condition or Proviso Nevertheless that if
the said Joseph Gill his Heirs Executors Adm^rs or Assigns Should and did well
and truly Pay or cause to be Paid unto the said William Brown his heirs Execu-
tors Administrators or Assigns the aforesaid Sum of four hundred and twenty
One Pounds and six Pence Sterling Money with legal Interest thereon at the
Rate of six Percent per Annum before the first Day of January Seventeen hundred and sixty five without fraud
or Deduction then the said Indenture and every Matter (cause Article) anything
therein contained should cease determine and be utterly void to all Intents
and Purposes whatsoever as in and by the same Indenture may more fully appear
