granted bargained and sold and by these presents Do and each of them Both grant
bargain and sell unto him the said Henry Brooks his Executors Administrato:
tors and Assigns All that Tract or parcell of Land called Pheasant Hills alias
Pheasants Hills lying and being in Prince Georges County and containing fifty two
Acres of Land also all that tract or parcell of Land called Trueman's Hills lying and
being in Prince Georges County aforesaid and containing one hundred and fifty Acres of
Land also that part of the aforesaid tract or parcell of Land called Pheasant Hill
which is contained within the lines courses and distances following to wit Beginning at
a bounded white Oak Standing by a branch side it being the beginning tree of a
tract of Land called Provostion and a bounded tree of Pheasant Hill running
thence East South East thirty three and an half perches thence by such a line
drawn Northly to intersect the given line of Pheasant Hill as will divide the
