defend by these Presents and it is further Covenanted and Granted  
by and Between the said John Brunts and Rezin Hammond that the said  
John Brunts and his Heirs shall and will at the Request of him the said  
Rezin Hammond and his Heirs make do or suffer to be done any other and  
further Reasonable Act or Acts thing or things Devise or Devises in the  
Law whatsoever which by him the said Rezin Hammond or his Heirs shall  
be thought proper for the better Suretie and more shure making of the said  
Lands and Premises unto him the said Rezin Hammond his Heirs and  
Assigns forever In Witnes whereof the Parties first above mentioned have
