therewith fully satisfy'd Contented and paid Hath given granted Bargain'd
and Sold Aliens Enfeoffed and confirmed and by these Presents doth give
grant Bargain Sell Alien Enfeoffe and confirme unto him the said Archable
Barr his Heirs and Assigns forever all that Tract or Parcel of Land called
Owings second chance lying and being in Frederick County aforesaid which is
contain'd within the following Metes and Bounds Courses and Distances
Viz^r Beginning for the Tract hereby bargained and sold at the end of one
Hundred and forty Pearches on the forty second Line of a Tract of Land called
Brothers Agreement and running thence South Seventy three East Three hundred
and twenty perches North Twenty three West Two hundred sixty five Pearches
West one hundred and twelve Pearches then to the Beginning containing Two
Hundred and fifty Acres of Land Together with all Right Proffits Priviledges
and Advantages Premises and Appurtenances to the said Bargain'd
Parcel of Land belonging or in any wise Appertaining To have and to hold the
said Bargain'd Parcel of Land with the Premises and Appurtenances unto
him the said Archable Barr his Heirs and Assigns forever and to his and their
only proper use and Behoof and the said Samuel Owings Jun. for himself and
his Heirs doth hereby Covenant grant and Promis and Agree to and with the
said Archable Barr his Heirs and Assigns that he the said Samuel Owings Jun.
and his Heirs shall and will Warrant and Defend the said Bargain'd Parcel of
Land with the Premises and Appurtenances unto him the said Archable Barr
his Heirs and Assigns forever against all and all Manner of Person or Persons
Lawfully claiming or hereafter Lawfully to claim from by or under him the said
Samuel Owings Jun. or his Heirs or by their Means or Procurement — In witness
