 50 shall, at any time prior to the said 30<sup>th</sup> day of June have been  
 51 written or printed upon vellum, parchment or paper not stamped  
 52 or marked according to law, or upon vellum, parchment or paper  
 53 stamped or marked at a lower rate of duty than is, by law, required  
 54 for such bond, note or other instrument, may be presented to any  
 55 collector of the customs within the state; and where there is  
 56 no such collector, to the marshal of the district, whose duty it  
 57 shall be, upon the payment of the duty with which such instru-  
 58 ment was chargeable, together with the additional sum of ten  
 59 dollars, to endorse upon some part of such instrument his receipt  
 60 for the same; and thereupon, the said bond, note or other  
 61 instrument shall be, to all intents and purposes, as valid and  
 62 available to the person holding the same as if it had been or  
 63 were stamped, counterstamped, or marked as by law required;  
 64 any thing in any act to the contrary, notwithstanding.

1 Sec. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That owners of stills whose  
 2 licenses to distil shall not have expired on the thirtieth day of  
 3 June next, shall, at their option, pay either the whole duty  
 4 which would have accrued on their stills on account of such  
 5 licenses, or the duty which would have accrued on said stills, on  
 6 the day aforesaid, if they had taken licenses ending on that day:  
 7 That owners of snuff-mills whose licenses had not expired on the  
 8 first day of June, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-six,  
 9 shall be allowed a deduction from the duties incurred on the same,

*For which duty and  
 additional sum the said  
 collector or marshal shall  
 be accountable to the  
 treasury of the United States.*

10 proportionate to the time thus remaining unexpired on such  
 11 licenses: That the several banks which may have agreed to pay  
 12 the annual composition of one per cent. on their dividends, in  
 13 lieu of the stamp duty on the notes issued by them, shall pay  
 14 only at the rate of one per cent. per annum, on such dividends,  
 15 to the thirtieth day of June next: That retailers of wines  
 16 and spirits, who may take licenses after the passing of this act,  
 17 shall pay for such licenses only in proportion to the time which  
 18 may intervene between the obtaining of such licenses and the  
 19 thirtieth day of June next: And that the owners of carriages  
 20 for the conveyance of persons, who may enter the same after the  
 21 passing of this act, and before the thirtieth day of June next,  
 22 shall pay the duty for the same only to the said thirtieth  
 23 day of June.

1 Sec. 4. *And be it further enacted*, That the supervisor of the  
 2 North West district shall, in addition to the same commissions on  
 3 the product of all the internal duties collected in his district, as  
 4 heretofore have been allowed to the supervisor of Ohio, be allow-  
 5 ed an annual salary of five hundred dollars, and at the rate of  
 6 three hundred dollars, per annum, for clerk-hire.

1 Sec. 6. *And be it further enacted*, That so much of any act, as  
 2 directs an annual entry of stills to be made, be, and the same  
 3 hereby is repealed.

1 Sec. 7. *And be it further enacted*, That the certificates accom-  
 2 panying foreign distilled spirits, wines and teas, which are now

*Sec. 5. And be it further enacted*, That the following extra allowances for clerk-hire shall be made for one year to the supervisors of the following districts, as a full compensation for the additional duties arising from the settlement of accounts of certain inspectors of the internal revenues whose offices have been suppressed by the President of the United States, that is to say: to each of the supervisors of Virginia, the sum of five hundred dollars, and to the supervisor of North Carolina, and South Carolina, the sum of eight hundred dollars.
