May 24th 1802

Inclosed you will find the Return of Taxes due on
Dwellings, Houses and Lands on this Day as I should
have made it before now, but I have been very ill
for some time I am in hopes it will be found right

Inclosed you will likewise find a List of persons who
had Slaves Tax'd to them and has sold them before the
List came into my hands or removed out of the State

before I will thank you to let me know what is
to be done with those accounts as it is out of my
power to collect them as they have no other property
except what the Law forbids me taking Inclosed you

likewise find an Act which I forwarded to S.
Murray County and have not heard from it as Mr.

Tanney will not pay it I will thank you to let
me know whether I can qualify as a Justice of the
Peace as the business now stands or not - I received

you of the 15th Instant and as you Request me to ~~inform~~
inform you that I have not received one single Act
from any collector, & so I remain your Humble Serv^t
