in which this should be done has now elapsed, and thereby
created a forfeiture of Register. Under these unusual cir-
cumstances all occasioned by an act of Providence. Your Peti-
tioner having first purchased the vessel when condemned,
and having now a bill of sale which is a relinquishment
from the Underwriters on account of their acceptance of the
abandonment, prays that the foreign Tonnage & light money
may be restored, the Forfeiture of the Register be remitted and
that a new one ^{my} issue in his name, which if issued in the different
names of the Company, would only create new disability, as from
their scattered situation they could not qualify to it within
the Ninety Days prescribed by Law. Your Petitioner, therefore
prays that for the reasons above assigned you will be pleased to
enquire into & cause the facts stated to be certified and transmitted
to the Secretary of the Treasury to the end that he may & should
he so fit admit the Forfeiture & disability which may have occur-
red and Your Petitioner will ever pray
