Mathew Mason & Peter Green both Sworn & Sent to the Grand jury

James Smith of Kent County & Province of Maryland Stantor Att. of John
Gandy Commander of Ship Anne and Mary of London comes into Court & acknowledges
a conveyance from said Gandy to John Dowdall of the County & Province aforesaid
for two hundred acres of Land Situate lying & being on the South Side of the Chester River
in the County & Province aforesaid upon a Branch called Barber Branch which said land
John Gandy bought of Robert Smith of Salbott County Esq. & commonly called & known
by the name of Grant

Capt. William Stackott comes into open Court and acknowledges a conveyance or Deed
made to John Dowdall of this County & Province for two hundred acres of Land Situate
lying & being on the South Side of the Chester River in Kent County & on the North Side of
a small branch of a brook called Double Brooks commonly called & known by the
name of Woolerhampton & wife came & after Stackott wife of said William
Stackott who being secretly examined out of the hearing of her said Husband according
to act of Assembly in that behalf made & provided did freely & voluntarily confess
that she did give up all & singular her Right Title Dower & Claim demands what so
ever of in or unto the said Land & premises without any Negation or Disparagement of her
said husband & of her own right might be Entered upon the Records of Kent County
. . . .

Emanuel Isaac acknowledged himself indebted unto our Sovereign Lord King
in the sum of Ten pounds in full just sum of Ten pounds Ster. to be carried
upon his Goods & Chattels & Lands & Tenements & conditioned he make not his person
appearance at the next Court to be hold for this County & good behaviour & obedience to
all his Majesty's Writs & Warrants in the mean time John Hollingsworth & Charles
Hollingsworth Jun. & Secularies of the said Emanuel Isaac comes into Court
& acknowledges themselves justly indebted unto our said Sovereign Lord King in
the sum of Ten pounds in full just sum of Ten pounds Ster. each to be carried
as above said & conditioned as above said whereunto they are all contented
