And said John Loyd comes into Court together wth Patrick Fraugh his Security
& said John doth acknowledge himself Indebted unto our Sovereign Lord King
Wm 3rd in full & just summe of Tenne pounds Sterl. to be carried upon his
goods and chattels & arrears & arrears & arrears conditioned he make not his personall appearance
at next Court & good behaviour in the mean while to all his Majesty's High Court
and said Patrick Fraugh Security of said John Loyd acknowledge himself
Indebted unto our said Sovereign Lord King in full & just summe of five
pound Sterl. to be carried as above said conditioned as above with the yard
both contained

Whereas John Alley being presented by Grand jury last Novem: Court

The which presentment was framed into Bill of Inditment as follows viz

hundred within the jurisdiction of this Court & holly blessed name of Almighty God by
swearing to several oaths did wickedly profane at & against the forms of
act of assembly in that case made

And said John Alley now appeared and submitt himself to Court
Therefore It is considered by Court here viz. this 27. day of Novem: Anno Dom: 1701
that said John Alley be fined the summe of Tenne Shillings Sterl. & likewise pay the summe of five
pound and three pence of Sterl. & said Alley in money
