

Novem. Court 1701

Command was given to the Sheriff of Kent County by 13 day of Feb<sup>r</sup> Anno Domini 1700 that by good and lawfull men of his bailiwick he make knowne Thomas Jagg and Jufannah his wife by the last will and Testament of Donis County late of said County Dec. if found in his bailiwick so that they do personally appear before his Majesty's Justice at the next Court together with cause if any they had why execution should not issue forth at them as well for the Summe of Eleven hundred & seventy six pounds of T<sup>r</sup>. Debt as also for the Summe of Six hundred Eighty and eight pounds of T<sup>r</sup>. cost according to a Judgment recovered against the said Donis in his life time at a Court hold for said County by 20 day of March by W<sup>m</sup> Warren and Comp<sup>s</sup> of Old England London Merchants Anno Domini 1699

At which next Court viz. by 25 day of March Anno Domini 1701 the day of the return of the writt came Elias King high Sheriff of said County and made returne thereof viz. a Mad & knowne unto the within named Thomas Jagg and Jufannah his wife before James Smith and Mathew Smith Two good and lawfull Men of my bailiwick as by this within writt James Commanded

On which said day the said Defend<sup>t</sup> by Michael Earle their Att<sup>y</sup> appeared and pray that he be impar<sup>t</sup> until the next Court which was granted them the same day was given the plaintiff the writt

The which cause being cont<sup>d</sup> from Court to Court until this present Court and the said cause now standing for Full came as well the said Defend<sup>t</sup> by Michael Earle their Att<sup>y</sup> as also the said Plaintiff by their Att<sup>y</sup> and the said Defend<sup>t</sup> in their proper persons nor by their Att<sup>y</sup> making any defence upon the prayer of the plaintiff Att<sup>y</sup> Judgment was awarded against them by Default

Therefore it is considered by the Court hold this day viz. by 20 day of Novem<sup>r</sup> Anno Domini 1701 that the said Plaintiff Wilkiam Warren and Comp<sup>s</sup> of Old England London Merchants have Execution at the said Defend<sup>t</sup> Thomas Jagg and Jufannah his wife by the last will and Testament of Donis County late of said County Dec. as well for the Summe of fourteen hundred forty and four pounds of T<sup>r</sup>. Debt as also for the Summe of two hundred & seventy six pounds of T<sup>r</sup>. of Costs of the said Defend<sup>t</sup> in money also In Dowdall

Command was given to the Sheriff of Kent County by 13 day of Feb<sup>r</sup> Anno Domini 1700 that he take Honor Donavant alias Dutis Honor Donavant Ad<sup>r</sup>. of all singular goods (shall be credited) of James Donavant late of Kent County planter Dec. if found in his bailiwick and her safe keeps so that he have her body before his Majesty's Justice at the next Court to be hold for said County to answer unto James Mitchell of the Kingdom of England Mariner of Cap<sup>t</sup> that she render unto him the just and full Summe of five hundred pound of every way well conditioned T<sup>r</sup> in C<sup>o</sup> which from him she unjustly obtained and At which next Court viz. by 25 day of March Anno Domini 1701 the day of the return of the said writt came Elias King high Sheriff of said County and made returne thereof viz.
