 ledged himselfe Justly indebted unto our said Sovereigne Lord King his heirs & Successors in  
 full & just Summe of five pounds Sterl. to be levied at ass<sup>es</sup>. conditioned as afores<sup>d</sup>. wherewith  
 they are both contented

Samuel Thomas of this County Planter comes into open Court & acknowledges to him selfe  
 Justly indebted unto our Sovereigne Lord King William 3<sup>rd</sup> his heirs & Successors  
 in full & just Summe of Tenn pounds Sterl. to be levied upon his lands & Tenement  
 goods & Chattels conditioned that the said Sam<sup>l</sup> Thomas do not make his personall appear-  
 ance at the next Court to be held for said County to prosecute as an Evidenced on behalfe  
 of his Maj<sup>ty</sup> against Waller Moske likewise James Edward Bathurst his Jourly &  
 acknowledged himselfe Justly indebted unto our said Sovereigne Lord King his heirs & Successors  
 in full & just Summe of five pounds Sterl. to be levied at ass<sup>es</sup>. conditioned as afores<sup>d</sup>.  
 wherewith they are both contented

Ordered by the Court here that Thomas Gwin of this County Planter have Allowed  
 him in the next County Court the Summe of one Thousand five hundred pounds of Sterl.  
 Annually for the Accomodating and Feeding of John Groom a poore man belonging to this County  
 It's Dowdlat's

Kent. It is considered by the Court here that whereas the Constables & Church wardens  
 have tooe neglected their Duties in not taking that due care which belongs to  
 them for preventing impolent peop<sup>l</sup> coming and inhabiting in the same  
 to the great damage thereof

It is therefore Ordered by this Court that if any Inhabitants of said County shall from  
 hence forward entertaine any such person or persons as are likely to be chargeable to the  
 same without first giving Notice to some of the Justices of said County in one or two days  
 after their coming, at farthest that all such persons shall be liable to keepes such  
 impolent person or persons at their owne charge without being in any way chargeable  
 to said County
