Thomas Allen servant to Mr<sup>r</sup> James Heath and coming into the County without Indentures  
was brought to Court to have his age adjudged The Court upon view of said servant adjudged  
him to be fifteen years of age and Ordered to serve his said Mr<sup>r</sup> according to out of a promise  
that was made & provided In Dowdall

Henry Hooper having made a motion to this Court that a servant Woman belonging to said  
Henry is brought to bed of a Mollattoe Child & desired that the Court would be pleased to Order  
that said Child might be taken away from said Childs father & kept off till she was  
The Court desired of said Henry Hooper that he would be pleased to let said Mother of said child  
keep it for a year & that he shall have satisfaction for said Child after some discourse with  
said Henry about said Childs Court doo agree to pay with said Henry to pay him One  
Thousand pounds of God. for keeping of said Mollattoe Child Twelve Months from the 1<sup>st</sup> of  
It is Ordered by this Court that said Henry Hooper have allowed him out of  
next years babyes & sum of one Thousand pounds of God. for keeping one Mollattoe Child  
of Margarett Bishop's Spaced of one whole year from the 1<sup>st</sup> of June In Dowdall

Thomas Ward of Kent County one of the Witnesses to a bill passed by James Tostley formerly of Salbold  
County & opposed upon the bill & desired that he doo of said James Tostley & said  
bill for four thousand pounds of God. to Thomas Ruff of Salbold County In Dowdall

Mary Kanaday servant to Thomas Joid & opposed upon the bill & desired that she doo of  
said Joid's servant doo of father of her said borne Child In Dowdall

Ordered Therefore by this Court that said Mary Kanaday and John C. Neale each of them doo  
of said Thomas Joid their Mr<sup>r</sup> half a year each of them for the trouble that said Thomas was put  
to about said Woman in her labour & the loss of service In Dowdall

John Bonnett being bound by recognizance taken before Mr<sup>r</sup> Whittington one of the Justices of this Court  
to make his person appear at this Court & good behaviour in & meanwhile now appeared but
