And the said Phillip Holbeger found into Court together with Saml Wallis & Thomas Springton his Sureties and the said Phillip doth oblige himself to our said Justices and to our Sovereign Lord King Wm the Third his heirs & Successors in full and just Tithes of Twenty pounds Sterl. to be levied upon his goods & Chattels & to make not his personal appearance here at the next Court in the mean time & of good behaviour and to appear to all his Majesty's Judges & Justices and the said Saml Wallis & Thomas Springton do acknowledge themselves to our said Justices and to our Sovereign Lord King Wm the Third his heirs & Successors to be bound in full and just Tithes of Twenty pounds Sterl. each to be levied as aforesaid
