Command was given to the Justices of Kent County 29 day of November 1700 that the said Henry Wilkes alias Dulab Henry Wilkes of Kent County Clerk and his wife Anne do give the said Justice of Kent County the sum of Ten pounds Ster. to be paid upon his lands & Tenements goods and chattels in case the said Henry Wilkes do not make his personal appearance here at the next Court and in the mean time he is of good behaviour to all his Majesty's Subjects and the said Henry Wilkes doth acknowledge his debt to owe the said King's Justice of Kent County the sum of Ten pounds Ster. to be paid as aforesaid when with the said content
