Robert Smith acknowledged A Conveyance to Sir Robert Polson for Two hundred thirty nine Acres being part of a tract of Land called Smiths Range

Grand Jury returned and shew'd as followeth viz  
Woe of Grand Jury doo p<sup>t</sup> sent Thomas Browne for that he & said Thomas Browne did take Grand young Marcs & one about two year old & Collier about one year old contrary to the peace of our Sovereign Lord King & J<sup>r</sup> Charles Honm  
Woe of Grand Jury doo p<sup>t</sup> sent Dan. Berry for that he & said Berry did take & oborall Civalards of horse kind & them did mark contrary to the peace of our Sovereign Lord King & J<sup>r</sup> Charles Honm

Woe of Grand Jury doo p<sup>t</sup> sent Thomas Tolley three of his men for that they did contrary to his Majesty's peace assault & beat the body of Sir Walter Keale on his Majesty's highway

Woe of Grand Jury doo p<sup>t</sup> sent Thomas Tolley for that he & said Tolley contrary to his Majesty's peace did in contempt thereof by force take from Dorothy Sudob & Corline warr. granted by Sir Thomas Smith one of his Majesty's Justices of Kent County

March 25. 1701 J<sup>r</sup> John Meriday one of the Grand Jury J<sup>r</sup> Charles Honm  
formerly doo hereby p<sup>t</sup> sent Catherine Burke for hauling & bestard childs all the house of Henry Green in Kent County within the jurisdiction of this Court given under my hand & day above

The Jury are contented & shew'd that a matter of forme not changing & matter of fact in the said

Ordered that J<sup>r</sup> Thos. of this County take into his custody & custody of J<sup>r</sup> Bonnell and Eliz. Polson & shew'd to remaine untill they find security for their appearance at the next Court. Good behaviour in the mean while & J<sup>r</sup> Dowdall

Ordered that Isaac Lauck creditte Grand Jury for two hundred pounds of J<sup>r</sup> Dowdall

The Grand Jury Discharged The Court Adjourned untill seven a clock tomorrow morning
