 find for doo they say we the Jury doo find for the Defendant and by Rich. Mason their  
 Foreman all of them soe said Judgment according to verdict

Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Defendant John Dubois do  
 to the said Alien god thereof without day And it is likewise considered that the said Defo.  
 doo recouse from the said Plaintiff Richard Jorum as a sum of fifty pounds of  
 Gold for a nonsuit according to Act of Assembly in that behalf made & provided as  
 a good sum of seven hundred Ninety and one pounds of Gold cost of Suits and  
 the said Richard Jorum in Money
