At which next Court viz. 28. day of Feb. Anno Dom. 1700 the Day of the return of said Writt according to Adjournment came Elias King high Sheriff of Kent County & made returns thereof in these words viz. Copy Certificates of Elias King Sheriff.

On which said Day of said Plaintiff by Richard Macklin their Attorney moved & prayed that the said Defendant Henry Kyngson may find 1000. l. bail to said action & that he may be committed unto the Sheriff's custody until he find 1000. l. bail which was granted unto him and

Ordered therefore that the said Defendant Henry Kyngson doo find 1000. l. bail to said action and that the Sheriff of this County of Kent doo take him into his custody & there to remaine until he find 1000. l. bail which was done accordingly and

But the said Defendant Henry Kyngson comes into Court together with Robert Smith his security who promises that the said Defendant Henry Kyngson shall pay condemnation of Captor else he will do it for him

On which said day of said Defendant Henry Kyngson in his proper person appeared and prayed thereof to be imparled until the next Court which was granted unto him & said Day was given to Plaintiff also

And now heard at this Day viz. 27. Day of March Anno Dom. 1703 James the Plaintiff by Richard Macklin their Attorney and the said Cause standing for Trial & Plaintiff Debit

Maryland - q. Henry Kyngson otherwise called Henry Kyngson of Kent County Blander was summoned to answer unto Benjamin Browne of London merchant of Apscha that he render him 1000. l. full and just. Sums of one Thousand Nine hundred thirty & five pounds of every way well conditioned safe So. in Casque which to him he oweth and from him he unjustly Detaind

And Whereupon the said Plaintiff by Richard Macklin his Att. complained and says that whereas the said Henry the 27. Day of Feb. Anno Dom. 1699. at Chester Kbor within the jurisdiction of this Court by his certain bill or Writing sealed with his Seal as his att. & good delivered and here in Court brought whose date is of same days yeare aff. did bind himself to his heirs & assigns to pay or cause to be paid unto the said Plaintiff or to his heirs & assigns the said Sums of 1935. l. So. qualified as aff. convenient in the said County at or upon the fourth Day of October next ensuing the Date of the said bill yet notwithstanding the said Henry the 1935. l. So. according to the tenor of the said bill unto the said Plaintiff did not pay but the said James to pay hath and still doth deny refuse to pay Damage of the said Plaintiff 3000. l. and thereupon he brings this Suit

But the said Plaintiff by his said Att. prays that the said Defendant might come into Court and answer to his said Debt. who neither by him self nor att. appearing Judg. is given against him by Default

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Plaintiff Benjamin Browne doo receive from the said Defendant Henry Kyngson as well by Sums of one thousand nine hundred thirty & five pounds of So. Debt as also by Sums Three hundred seventy and one pounds of So. of Suits and the said Henry Kyngson in Money
