 to be judged whether they were good for nine years according to the

 It was therefor considered by the Court that the said Indentures for the term  
 of nine years are good & authentic to cause the said Servant William Humphries  
 to serve his said Master John Austlin nine years from the time of the Ships Dropping  
 Anchor

And the said John Austlin prays the Court that they would be pleased to judge of  
 the age of the said Serv<sup>t</sup>. W<sup>m</sup>. Humphries and the Court upon view of the said  
 Servant doth judge him to be four years of age
