 granted. Ordered therefore that the said Thomas Browne be Wards by
 Proclamation which was done accordingly

 bills of the said Gentleman was framed into a bill of Indultment as follows
 The Jurors for our Sovereign Lord the King that now is for the County
 of Kent upon their oaths do present Daniel Berry for that he the said
 Dan. Berry on the second day of March Anno Dom. 1700 at four hundred in
 Kent County within the jurisdiction of this Court by force of arms one horse of
 price of three pounds ster. & proper horse of a person unknowne & knowingly
 did take and carry away against the peace of our Sovereign Lord the King and against
 the form of the act of assembly in that behalf made & did so maintain Anno Dom. Regis
 not guilty of treason & he who follows for our Lord the King
 says he is guilty - Michael Barlow Dom. Regis

Command was therefore given to the Just. of Kent County that he cause to come in
 here twelve of whom he was to recognize the man who made answer
 he had then ready twelve as by his process he was commanded vizt William
 Glandvill Foreman John Bondor Christopher Bindor William Sigley Henry Green
 Nathaniel Flower Thomas Carman Gabriel Bryan Thomas Lynes Thomas Pugh and
 Thomas Ford and Thomas Smith which Jury being duly Sworn to try the said
 above Joyned and having heard the Pledings & Evidence the Court quitted them
