Full & just sum of four hundred Eighty & nine pounds of good Sound merchantable Caffe
 Tob. in Caffe which to them he oweth & from them he unjustly detaineth
 And where upon Said Plaintiff by Richard Macklin their Att. Saith that whereas Said
 Thomas Carman on the first day of May Anno Dom. 1700 at the House of the said County
 within the jurisdiction of this Court by his Certain bill or writing obligatory to the said
 ad. his act & doct. delivered & here in Court brought whose date is the said day of said
 said himself his heirs &c. doth to pay or cause to be paid unto Said John Hodg
 of London Merchant James Smith & Tantor Comp. their heirs &c. doth or assigns
 or his full Att. of Said sum of four hundred Eighty & nine pounds of Tob. &
 qualified as aff. London in the House of the said County on the said day of October
 ensuing the date of the said bill. Notwithstanding Said Thomas & Said sum of
 Tob. according to the tenor of the said bill unto Said Plaintiff he hath not paid
 all the often Demanded but Said to pay hath denied & refused & still doth deny
 refuse and unjustly detaineth to Said Plaintiff Eight hundred Ninety
 & eight pounds of Caffe Tob. and thereupon they bring their Suits

But Said Thomas Carman Defendant comes into Court together with Flower
 Walker his Security who obligeth himself that Said Defendant Thomas Carman
 shall pay Condemnation if Caffe or Caffe he will do it for him
 After which Said Defendant comes into Court & Condemns Judgment in his
 proper person for Said sum of four hundred Eighty & nine pounds of Tob.
 and Cost of Suits

Therefore it is Considered by the Court that Said Plaintiff John Hodg of London
 Merchant James Smith & Tantor Comp. doth recover from Said Defendant Thomas
 Carman as well Said sum of four hundred Eighty & nine pounds of Tob. as
 as also Said sum of Three hundred forty & five pounds of Tob. Cost of Suit of Said
 Thomas Carman in Money

Mane was given to the Thort. of Kent County on Thirtenth day of Feb. 1701
 Anno Dom. 1701 that his Sake James Williams alias ditto James Williams of
 Said County if found in his bailiwick & him safe keep & do that he have his body before
 his Majesty's Justice at the next Court to be hold for Said County of a plea that he render
 unto him one young Mare between four & five years of age found within and the which
 he doth

At which next Court viz. the 25. Day of March Anno Dom. 1701 the Day of
 return of Said writ came Elias King High Thort. of Said County made return of
 writ in these words viz. for the said
 And Said James Williams by Richard Macklin his Att. appeared & prayd that he
 Imparts untill the next Court which was granted unto him & Said day was given
 to Plaintiff
