- (3) Renovation of interior OR EXTERIOR of Denton-Weeks House......\$25,000

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act [[shall take effect July 1, 1976.]] is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety and having been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 425

(House Bill 752)

AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws - Two-stage Vehicles

FOR the purpose of defining a two-stage vehicle, manufacturers of two-stage vehicles, and related terms; requiring the licensing of two-stage manufacturers and dealers in certain instances; providing for the transfer of two-stage vehicles; and generally relating to manufacturers and dealers of two-stage vehicles.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
