RESOLVED, That subsidized housing projects for the elderly include utilities in the cost of rent, in order to protect elderly residents against unaffordable utility rate increases; and be it further

(Senate Joint Resolution No. 61)

A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

Mentally Retarded - Residential Needs

FOR the purpose of requesting the Governor to appoint a commission to study the residential needs of the mentally retarded, both institutional needs and community-based needs.

WHEREAS, There has never been a complete and comprehensive Statewide study of the residential needs of the mentally retarded; and

WHEREAS, The Mental Retardation Administration wishes to spend approximately \$25,000,000 to renovate Rosewood Center; and

WHEREAS, The financial resouces committed to the development of community-based residential programs has been minimal; and

WHEREAS, The Mental Retardation Administration has made little use of alternative living units such as apartments, group homes, and intermediate care facilities/nursing homes: and

WHEREAS, The type of residential services provided in State-operated institutions may in some cases be inappropriate; and

WHEREAS, The State-operated institutions for the retarded are serving a large number of individuals that do not require such a high level of care; and
