A House Joint Resolution concerning

Young Adult Environmental Program

FOR the purpose of requesting the Governor to appoint a Task Force to study the desirability of implementing in Maryland a program providing young adults with training and employment in environmental improvement activities in both urban and nonurban areas.

WHEREAS, The unemployment rate among young adults is excessively high; and

WHEREAS, Young adults facing the current slack economy have very limited opportunities to gain the job experience, training and skills required to compete successfully in the labor market; and

WHEREAS, Unemployment among young adults contributes to alienation, crime, and a variety of other social ills; constitutes a drain upon social service resources and a loss of tax revenues; and thereby has a pervasive negative effect on the quality of life in the State; and

WHEREAS, Both urban and nonurban areas of the State would profit from an expansion of environmental improvement activities; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Governor be requested to appoint a Task Force to study the desirability and feasibility of implementing a program providing young adults, ages 18 to 24, with training and employment in environmental improvement activities in both urban and nonurban areas; and be it
